The 2019 Düsseldorf-Jülich Symposium on Neurodegenerative Diseases: "Aggregation, Fibrils, Autophagy, Prions, and Biomarkers" with a strong focus on Alzheimer's disease, a very complex and so far incurable neurodegenerative disease, serves as a forum for discussing new scientific findings, diagnostic procedures and possible therapeutic approaches. Leading scientists from various disciplines will present their latest research results at this interdisciplinary scientific symposium on neurodegenerative diseases.



Talks: Internationally renowned experts will present 17 talks over the course of three days. All speakers will present their respective topics in an easily comprehensible way, before presenting their complex research results in detail.



Talks by early career scientists: From the poster abstracts submitted, five will be selected and their authors invited to give a 20-minute lecture in the main programme in addition to their poster presentation.



Poster Session: A poster session takes place on day 2. We welcome abstract submissions on Alzheimer's topics as well as other neurodegenerative diseases. Supported by the 'Alzheimer Forschung Initiative e.V.', 3 poster prizes will be awarded.



Registration: Registration is free of charge. However, the number of participants is limited to 150. Please register before **01 September 2019**.
